Banyo night and Sunday works

As part of construction of the Banyo stabling facility, Queensland Rail and CPB Contractors are continuing to undertake works between Bindha and Nudgee stations.

The activities outlined below are scheduled to occur at night and on a Sunday between **17 – 20 March 2017**, weather and construction conditions permitting. These activities will occur outside the project's normal working hours, as outlined below:

You will notice the following around your local area and on-site during these works:

- Delivery trucks and workers' vehicles entering the site via Guardhouse Road, Railway Parade (north and south), Royal Parade, Purchase Street and Park Street
- Vehicle routes will include Guardhouse Road, St Vincents Road, Tufnell Road, St Achs Street, Elliott Road, Purchase Street, Earnshaw Road, Eames Street, Park Street and Royal Parade
- Delivery and unloading of materials and use of machinery such as excavators, mobile cranes, front-end loaders, generators, track mountable excavators and compaction equipment
- Use of small power tools such as drills, saws and minor vibrating equipment
- Ongoing use of a temporary work and laydown area at the rear of Banyo Memorial Park. Pedestrian access will continue to be maintained through the park during works
- Changed traffic conditions, including reduced speed limits and short traffic delays, will be experienced. Traffic controllers will be on-site when required to assist with changes to pedestrian and vehicle movements.

Royal Parade Visual Barrier Update

The construction of a visual barrier along Royal Parade will commence on **13 March 2017** and is expected to take approximately eight weeks to complete. Temporary fencing to form a construction area for this work will be installed along the project fence line adjacent to Royal Parade. Activities for the construction of the visual barrier include:

- Potholing and service identification
- Tree trimming
- Installation of concrete footings
- Installation of steel posts
- Installation of wall panels.

Following construction completion, the outside face of the wall will be painted with the mural artwork theme 'The Natural World', which was chosen through feedback from Royal Parade residents. Painting of the mural is expected to take three weeks to complete, weather permitting.
