Work has commenced on the restoration of the Graceville station subway mural, following the completion of the station accessibility upgrade last year.

Queensland Rail's Positive pARTnerships team is now calling on the local community to get involved and send in images of contemporary life in your suburb to inspire the design of new elements for the station's artwork.

Photos submitted could show a variety of activities representing life in the Graceville area – from people shopping or enjoying coffee at local cafes, playing sport in your backyard or taking the dog for a walk.

It could also be your favourite places to visit, iconic landmarks, your home or local wildlife.

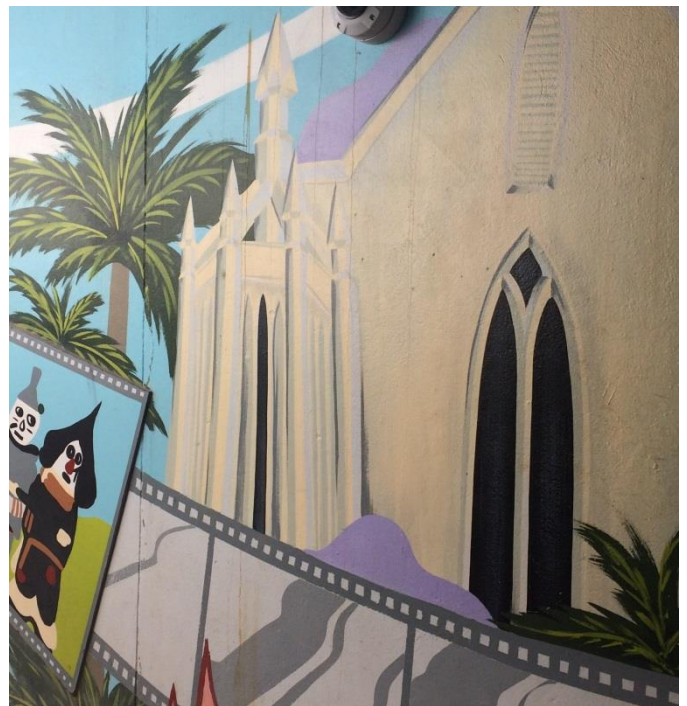
To complement the restored original mural, these locally-inspired scenes will be developed for the new staircase to platform 3 and 4 as well as the Appel Street bike lockers.
