

Newmarket station accessibility upgrade

Project update – December 2016

The Newmarket station accessibility upgrade is part of Queensland Rail's \$212 million upgrade program and is expected to be completed by mid-2017, weather and construction conditions permitting.

Project progress

The following construction activities were recently completed:

- platform works including excavation and installation of lift shaft walls
- moving the station building back to its original location
- piling and foundation installations for the new footbridge to Abuklea Street.

Upcoming work

In the coming weeks, customers and the community will see the following activities:

- installation of coping stones on the platform
- pedestrian subway works
- electrical infrastructure works
- ongoing works on the station building, lift shafts and staircase.

The subway will remain closed to the public for the duration of works. All access to the temporary platforms will be from the Wilston Road level crossing end of the station.

Christmas shutdown

The Newmarket station accessibility upgrade project will be closed from Saturday 24 December 2016, returning Tuesday 3 January 2017. No project upgrade works will take place during this time.



Construction impacts

Customers, residents and businesses adjacent to Newmarket station may experience the following:

- noise associated with heavy machinery
- use of reversing beepers
- changed traffic and parking conditions
- mobile lighting towers for night works
- increased vehicle movements around the work zones
- temporary changes to access paths throughout the station precinct.

Pedestrians are advised to follow all directional signage during this time.

Residents and other stakeholders will be given advance notification of construction activities likely to cause impacts, including after-hours work (nights and Sundays as required).
