PROJECT UPDATE – SEPTEMBER 2020

The East Ipswich station accessibility upgrade is part of the State Government's \$357 million investment to upgrade stations across the South East Queensland network, making them accessible for all customers.

Project progress


The following works have been undertaken recently at East Ipswich:

- commencement of detailed design
- contractor mobilisation, site establishment and fencing of work zones
- ongoing community and stakeholder engagement.

Upcoming works

In the coming weeks customers and the community can expect to see the following activities:

- commencement of main construction
- track and civil works (during weekend track closure, 5 and 6 September)
- tree removal (in the rail corridor, Merton Street) to enable construction works
- excavation and foundation screw piling (drilling)
- commencement of stormwater works – Coronation Street (southern) side of the station.



Construction impacts

The station upgrade has been designed with consideration given to local trees and preserving the 'look and feel' of the station surrounds.

During works, construction activities may involve:

- changed parking and traffic conditions for safety
- noise associated with heavy machinery
- temporary changes to access paths throughout the station precinct and surrounding areas
- increased vehicle movements near works
- mobile lighting towers for night works.

Normal working hours are 6.30am to 6.30pm, Monday to Saturday.

The local community will be given advance notification of construction activities likely to cause impacts, including after hours work (nights, Sundays and public holidays, if required).
