Asbestos removal Banyo

During site preparation for construction of the Banyo stabling facility, CPB Contractors (formerly known as Leighton Contractors) located a 250 metre asbestos pipe within the project site adjacent to the Shorncliffe railway line.

CPB Contractors has appointed a licensed asbestos removal contractor to remove it.

This process will start in mid-February 2016 and continue for approximately two weeks, weather and construction conditions permitting. Work hours will be from 6.30am to 5pm, Monday to Saturday.

The activity poses no risk to public safety. The asbestos that has been identified is a bonded, non-friable asbestos called Chrysotile (White Asbestos) and Amosite (Brown Asbestos), a previously commonly-used construction material.

The work site is contained within the Queensland Rail property boundary. Close neighbours overlooking the site may notice new fencing and barricades around the work zone. They may also notice a small team of people in protective clothing, including overalls, gloves and masks, systematically removing the asbestos pipe.

All work will be carried out in accordance with Queensland's Work Health and Safety Act 2011 and other codes, which outline the legal obligations and requirements that need to be followed to ensure the safe removal and disposal of asbestos. In accordance with Section 466 of the Workplace Health and Safety Regulation 2011, Workplace Health and Safety Queensland (WHSQ) have been notified of the asbestos removal.

A staged approach to asbestos removal at this site will continue as work progresses and extends to other areas of the site. All work will be managed in accordance with the same safety procedures.

Queensland Rail and CPB Contractors are dedicated to ensuring the safety of both our staff and the local community while carrying out this work.
