The Burpengary station accessibility upgrade is part of the State Government's ongoing investment to upgrade stations to make them accessible for everyone.



Project benefits

Burpengary station is being upgraded to make it more accessible, and easier for customers and the community to travel on our network. The new, modern station will help people in wheelchairs, parents with prams and those travelling with luggage or who are injured use the station with ease.



Construction progress

Since the closure of Burpengary station on Monday 22 January 2024, major work has been progressing on site including:

- ✓ site establishment
- ✓ installation of lift shafts
- ✓ installation of new footbridge and supporting columns
- ✓ demolition of old timber footbridge
- ✓ installation of concrete platform edges
- ✓ demolition of carpark areas
- ✓ installation of new prefabricated station building
- ✓ installation of underground services.

Upcoming works

You can expect to see the following upcoming activities on site:

- installation of footbridge stairs
- station building fit-out works including service connections
- platform raising works
- accessible parking improvements
- installation of platform shelters, station furniture and customer information infrastructure.

Works will generally take place between 6am and 6pm Monday to Saturday, unless notified. Every effort will be made to carry out these works with respect for our neighbours and customers.

Alternative transport

Shuttle bus 661 continues to operate between Burpengary and Narangba stations to keep customers moving during the station upgrade.
