## SEQ Rail Stabling Program - Elimbah Construction update – December 2015 and January 2016

From Monday 7 December 2015 through to the end of January 2016, various construction activities will be undertaken to continue work on the Elimbah stabling facility.

Activities will include:

- Delivery of fill and capping material to site
- Placement of ballast to form the track bed
- Delivery of concrete sleepers and fence materials
- Construction of stabling facility security fencing adjacent to Beerburum Road
- Installation of site drainage.

You may notice some changes around your local area and on site including:

- Increased truck and vehicle movements along Beerburum Road, Sanna Lane and Mansfield Road from Monday to Saturday 6:30am to 5:00pm. Some deliveries may use alternative routes dependent on the origin of the supplier.
- Workers may arrive onsite between 5.30am and 6.30am to prepare for the day's activities
- Heavy vehicle access via the end of Sanna Court to allow haulage vehicles to complete a loading circuit and exit the site safely
- Establishment of storage and lay down areas for construction materials
- Changed traffic conditions may be in effect on Beerburum Road during drainage works, including reduced speed limits and short-term traffic stoppages.

The project team will endeavor to minimise impacts to neighboring residents and businesses, including noise and dust, during construction of the Elimbah stabling facility. We appreciate your patience during the construction period and will continue to update you as work progresses.

### Project information

The South East Queensland (SEQ) Stabling Program involves the design and construction of new or additional train stabling facilities in four locations: Robina, Banyo, Elimbah and Woombye.

The \$116 million project was announced on Wednesday, 6 May 2015. The SEQ Stabling Program is part of the broader New Generation Rollingstock project that will see 75 new suburban six-car trains added to the South East Queensland City network, a 30 per cent increase of the current fleet.

Leighton Contractors will design and construct the new stabling facilities to help house 75 new six-car trains which will commence services in mid-2016.
