

Lindum station accessibility upgrade



PROJECT UPDATE – APRIL 2025

The Lindum station accessibility upgrade is part of Queensland Rail's program to make our stations accessible for everyone.

About the project

Since Lindum station reopened to customers in December 2024, the project team has continued with various finishing activities throughout the precinct.

When completed, the upgraded station will be more accessible, making it easier for customers to travel on our network.

People in wheelchairs, parents with prams and those travelling with luggage or who are injured, will be able to access our trains with ease.

Construction progress

Activities recently undertaken at Lindum include:

- reinstatement of a temporary path connecting the station with Iona College
- removal and remediation of the old section of platform 2 (nearest the level crossing)
- opening of the public station entrance via Sibley Road (pictured, below)
- improved pedestrian access to the precinct, connecting with footpaths.



Upcoming works

Customers and the community can expect to see the following activities in the coming weeks:

- continuing finishing works throughout the station precinct including electrical cable tray covers
- completion activities for the upgraded Sibley Road kiss 'n' ride
- preparations for construction of the new bicycle facilities
- Northern park 'n' ride expansion - excavation of the carpark and ground stabilisation (pictured, above)
- Northern park 'n' ride entry and roadworks (Eccles Street)
- landscaping establishment and maintenance.

Construction impacts

Works will generally take place between **6am and 6pm, Monday to Saturday**, unless notified. Prior notification will be provided for after hours activities (nights, Sundays or public holidays).
