



Testing and commissioning of the Moreton Bay Rail Link

The 14 kilometres of new track infrastructure for the Moreton Bay Rail Link (MBRL) has been completed. In preparation for the line's opening in mid-2016, Queensland Rail will now undertake comprehensive testing on the line from early March 2016.

As part of this testing program, Moreton Bay residents will notice trains running on the line as Queensland Rail tests the track and signalling infrastructure for safety and performance.

This testing will be undertaken mostly during the day. Testing may be required intermittently at night and on weekends, however nearby residents will be notified ahead of time.

Train testing

Train testing will include:

- Up to four trains at a time operating between Petrie and Kippa-Ring stations
- Testing of stabling yard facilities at Kippa-Ring
- Testing of the train signalling equipment
- Testing the speed of trains.

Driver and guard route training

Drivers will be required to familiarise themselves with:

- Location of stopping marks (indicator of where the train will stop at platforms)
- Signal locations including departure signals
- Train speeds entering and leaving the platform.

Queensland Rail is aware that those living close to our railway lines can experience varying levels of noise. We are committed to reducing noise impacts to communities wherever reasonable and practicable.
