

# After hours works Banyo station



## What?

Queensland Rail will undertake after hours and weekend works in late March and April 2024, as part of the Banyo station accessibility upgrade.

Night works (March) are a continuation of current Energex activities and include excavation, underboring (tunnelling) and concrete pumping. The weekend works (April track closure) include piling which can only be undertaken when there are no rail services operating and overhead power can be switched off.



## When?

Night works from **9pm until 5am** the next day on:

- **Sunday 24 to Thursday 28 March.**

Around-the-clock weekend works during the planned track closure:

- **6am Saturday 13 to 6pm Sunday 14 April.**

Where possible, noisiest activities will be scheduled prior to 10pm.



## Where?

Night works will continue in footpath areas in the vicinity of the level crossing at the corner of St Vincent's Road, Tufnell Road and Royal Parade east.

Weekend works will occur throughout the station precinct including platforms, station carpark, adjacent work zones and footpath areas.



## Impacts



Operation of vacuum excavators, piling rigs, concrete pumping trucks and vehicles with flashing lights and reversing beepers



Night works and around-the-clock weekend works



Lane closures and traffic management



Construction noise, piling works, use of concrete saw cutters, tunnelling equipment, concrete pumps and powered tools



Lighting towers at night
