

## SEQ Rail Stabling Program - Robina construction update



From 6.30am Monday 13 June 2016 to 4.00am Monday 20 June 2016, works will be undertaken 24-hours a day to prepare the new stabling facility for operation, weather conditions permitting. This is the final stage of works required to expand the Robina stabling facility.

During this period, work will include:

- Erecting mast structures
- Installing overhead line equipment
- Commissioning the overhead line equipment
- Commissioning of new signaling equipment.

You will notice the following around your local area and on-site during these works:

- Delivery trucks and workers' vehicles entering the site via Bayberry Lane and Centreline Place
- Delivery and unloading of materials
- Use of machinery such as small trucks, mobile cranes, generators, front end loaders, excavators, track mountable vehicles and small power tools such as drills, saws and minor vibratory equipment
- Use of mobile lighting towers to light the work areas.

Additionally, from 12.00am to 7.00am on Saturday 18 June 2016, there will be impacts to all electrical services at the Robina railway station, including lighting, lifts and ticket machines, while works are undertaken to inspect and test the main switchboard.

Every effort will be made to keep disruption to a minimum. Your ongoing patience during construction is appreciated.

## Project information

The South East Queensland (SEQ) Stabling Program involves the design and construction of new or additional train stabling facilities in four locations: Robina, Banyo, Elimbah and Woombye.

The \$116 million project was announced in May 2015. The SEQ Stabling Program is part of the broader New Generation Rollingstock project that will see 75 new suburban six-car trains added to the South East Queensland City network, a 30 per cent increase of the current fleet.

CPB Contractors will design and construct the new stabling facilities to help house 75 new six-car trains which will commence services in the second half of 2016.
