

## SEQ Rail Stabling Program

### Woombye - January construction update



As part of the SEQ Rail Stabling Program, Queensland Rail and CPB Contractors will be undertaking vital construction activities within the railway corridor during the scheduled track closure of the North Coast line on 28 and 29 January 2017.

Works undertaken as part of the scheduled track closure will occur **continuously from 5am Saturday 28 January until 10pm Sunday 29 January 2017**, weather permitting. Some activity is likely to commence around 4am with workers arriving to site and preparing for the works.

The scheduled track closure works will include:

- Installing overhead equipment masts and wiring
- Installing signal cables underneath the railway line
- Installing signal structures.

In addition to the above works, the following construction activities will be undertaken **Monday to Saturday between 6.30am and 5pm, throughout January and into February 2017**, weather and construction conditions permitting:

- Earthworks and pavement for the stabling facility access road and carpark
- Roadworks on Back Woombye Road to improve vehicle access into the facility
- Asphaltting train crew footpaths and carpark access road
- Installing lighting and CCTV poles
- Installing overhead cables and wiring
- Installing the security fence for the stabling facility
- Installing storm water drainage
- Miscellaneous concrete works
- Landscaping.

# For your information



Construction activities will include the use of machinery such as excavators, mobile cranes, front-end loaders, trucks, generators, grader, smooth drum roller, vacuum excavation trucks, concrete trucks and small power tools such as drills, track welders, saws and hammers.

You will notice the following around your local area and on-site during these works:

- Increased truck and vehicle movements along Old Palmwoods Road and Back Woombye Road from Monday to Saturday 6.30am to 5pm for deliveries of material and equipment to site
- Old Palmwoods Road, Back Woombye Road, Blackall Range Road and Reids Road will be the primary haulage routes during the project, however, some light vehicles may use alternative routes depending on the origin of the supplier.

The Project Team will endeavour to minimise the impact of works on neighbouring residents as much as possible. This includes:

- Toolbox talks with work crews to remind them of out-of-hours work protocols e.g. no unnecessary shouting, whistling, beeping car horns
- Using only the required and quietest possible equipment for these works.

We appreciate your patience during the construction period and will continue to update you as work progresses.
