

Gumlu crossing loop works

July and August 2019

Queensland Rail is undertaking works to extend eight rail crossing loops between Rockhampton and Townsville. These crossing loops allow the passing of freight services on what is otherwise a single track.

Upon completion of the project in mid-2021, freight trains up to 950 metres long will be able to use the network, a 45 percent increase from the current maximum length of 650 metres. This will provide a vital increase for freight transport in Queensland.

Civil Mining & Construction Pty Ltd has been appointed to undertake the earthwork, design and construction on behalf of Queensland Rail and will be on site at Gumlu from late July to commence work.

Works will generally be undertaken during the day and will coincide with other closures of the line in order to minimise the impact on freight customers and passenger services.
